NORWOOD PARK HISTORICAL SOCIETY OPENS

“THE NORTH POLE SWEET SHOPPE” ON DEC. 7 ONLY

Put a sugary coating on your Holiday spirit with a visit to “The North Pole Sweet Shoppe,” on the grounds of the historic Noble-Seymour-Crippen House (Chicago’s oldest). The one-day special event will be held from 10 a.m. – 2 p.m., on Dec. 7, in the barn behind the house, 5624 N. Newark Ave., in Chicago’s Norwood Park community. The “Sweet Shoppe” will be festively decorated to reflect Santa’s workshop.

The shoppe will offer a wide assortment of attractively packaged home-made holiday baked goods, including Bundtlettes, cakes, cookies, fudge, jams, jellies, peanut brittle, and select small gift items. All items are just \$5 per package, and volunteer elves will be available to assist shoppers with holiday purchases. Local author’s books will also be for sale and make great holiday gifts for young and old alike. Purchases can be made by cash, credit or debit card.

After shopping, take time to tour the inside of the historic Noble-Seymour-Crippen House, which will be decorated to reflect the coming-of-age era of Louisa May Alcott and her sisters as she depicted them in her post-Civil War novel, *Little Women*.
